CSI Philately 2011 – Uncovering the Less Than Obvious with Mercer Bristow

Ever wonder what the experts look for when they examine stamps and covers for formal certification for authenticity and condition? Here is your opportunity to get hands-on experience in revealing spurious philatelic material.



The American Philatelic Expertizing Service (APEX) was first offered by the APS in 1903. Today, over 130 examiners, both collectors and dealers, are part of the largest pool of philatelic expertise in the world. Mercer will take you on a virtual tour of the APEX offices, revealing the day-to-day operations and explain the methods of detective work used by the committee. You will become familiar with the various tools used to uncover hidden flaws, characteristics of forgeries, and how the final opinion is formed. Mercer will also review the published works that help “experts” arrive at their conclusions. The genuine and forged material used for the seminar will be both U.S. and worldwide. So we will cover whatever you might personally collect. Don’t forget to bring along your problem stamps. The class will work together as a team to identify and certify them. While it will be touched on during the course, a basic knowledge in printing techniques is a prerequisite.

Mercer Bristow, a lifelong collector, has headed the American Philatelic Expertizing Service (APEX) since he joined the APS staff in 1981. His interest in the art and science of philatelic expertizing began as a full-time lot describer for Matthew Bennett Auctions (1977-80) and in part time retail with the Handy Stamp Company (1974-81). He established and curates the APS Philatelic Reference Collections since 1992, and established the APS Quick ID Service in 2005.

Course Schedule

The Course begins each day at 9:00 a.m. and concludes after 4:30 p.m. with a break for lunch. Meet in the Lake Lucien room of the Homewood Suites by Hilton, 290 Southhall Lane, Maitland, FL 32751. Lunches and dinner are at the participants’ expense. The APS is arranging several local options for meals.
