## "STAR OF THE SHOW"



When the doors to the "Florex 66" exhibition open, visitors will be afforded the opportunity to see the single most valuable U. S. Stamp — the 24¢ airmail invert issued by the United States in 1918.

We are indebted to Mr. Herman Herst, Jr. noted stamp dealer from Shrub Oak, N. Y. for the privilege of including this rarity in our show.

A similar stamp was sold in a 1964 auction for \$15,500, the highest price ever paid for a single U. S. stamp up to that time.

Originally, there were 100 known copies of this stamp. They were first discovered by William Robey, a businessman and collector from Washington, D. C. He purchased them at the Benjamin Franklin Post Office in Washington on May 13, 1918.

This was the first day of sale of the 24¢ airmail stamps and Mr. Robey purchased a full pane of 100 in order to send first day covers to some friends and to have a plate block for himself. As soon as the postal clerk handed him the stamps he noted that the airplane in the center of the stamp had been printed upside down. He paid the clerk \$24 and asked if he had more stamps like them. After examining several panes and finding them normal Robey pointed out the errors to the curious clerk. He in turn tried to persuade Mr. Robey to return the stamps, claiming postal regulations forbid the sale of defective stamps. Mr. Robey stood firm on the grounds he had paid for them and they were his property. He returned to his office and locked them in his safe.

Shortly thereafter, postal inspectors arrived and despite their intense efforts Mr. Robey maintained his position.

Mr. Robey was not wealthy so he decided to sell the stamps and take a quick profit. He first went to Eugene Klein, a Philadelphia dealer, who was reputed to act as agent for the multi-millionaire, Colonel Green, who was an avid collector. Green was at sea aboard his yacht and could not be reached so Robey went to see the New York dealers where the best offer was \$1.00 apiece. Bitterly disappointed, he dropped in on Mr. Klein on his journey home. Klein took a seven-day option on the stamps and on the seventh day was offered \$15,000 by Klein, which he accepted. Colonel Green took the valuable position blocks and the remainder were sold at \$200 each.

## *The Circus Motif*



The sumptuous mansion of John and Mabel Ringling was built on Sarasota Bay in 1925 at a cost of \$1,500,000. A colorful Venetian palace, the building is patterned after the Doge Palace on the Grand Canal in Venice, Italy. Its 32 rooms are elaborately furnished with objects from all over the world and maintained in all their opulence from the marble swimming pool, great pipe organ, gold fixtured bathroom to the bar from Cicardi's Winter Garden.

It is altogether appropriate that Manatee, Sarasota and Venice Stamp Clubs should choose a circus motif for "FLOREX 66".

When the Ringlings became winter residents in 1911, the entire area was Manatee County. Ten years later Sarasota was incorporated as a County.

On Christmas Day in 1927 THE GREATEST SHOW ON EARTH opened winter headquarters in Sarasota where it proved to be a leading tourist attraction — as it still is in Venice where it moved several years ago.

The circus people became valued citizens of the area and made great contributions to the growth and economic well being of our communities. The palatial John Ringling home and the John and Mabel Museum of Art were deeded to the State of Florida for continued enjoyment of all.
