

### United Nations Postal Chief Is Florex Banquet Speaker

#### UN STAMP SALES

Mint United Nations postage stamps will be on sale at face value for the first time ever in Florida during FLOREX 68 Nov. 1-3.

Robert W. Maxwell, chief of the UN Postal Administration, has authorized a sales booth supervised by a UN staff member where FLOREX visitors may add to existing collections or start new ones.

Look for the booth near the large and exciting special exhibit of UN philatelic material in the exhibition hall.

FLOREX '68 is privileged to have Robert W. Maxwell, chief of the United Nations Postal Administration, as the honored guest for this 19th annual convention and exhibition of the Florida Federation of Stamp Clubs.

During the two short years since Mr. Maxwell was named UN postal chief Nov. 21, 1966, he has made a lasting impression on the hobby of Philately while making a host of new friends for the United Nations and UN postal issues.

Prior to moving to his present post, he was acting chief of the Mineral and Survey Section of the Special Fund Operations in the Department of Economic and Social Affairs at U.N. Headquarters

Mr. Maxwell was born in Needham, Massachusetts in 1921. After graduating from Auburn High School in 1939, he spent his freshmen year at Yankton College in South Dakota, transferring from there to Bowdoin College in Maine, from which he graduated with an honours degree in English literature in 1942.

Early in 1943, he joined the US Army and was sent to the European theatre shortly after the Normandy invasion in 1944. He ended his military service in 1946 as a first-lieutenant with Seventh Army Headquarters in Heidelberg, Germany.

Mr. Maxwell attended the Columbia University School of International Affairs as a candidate for a Master's degree in international affairs for the academic year 1946-47, during which time he became one of the founding editors of the Columbia Journal of International Affairs.

In the summer of 1947, he and other students from Columbia were permitted to work as interns in the United Nations Secretariat at Lake Success, in order to gather material for the first issue of the Journal. This marked the beginning of the present international internship programme.

In September 1947, Mr. Maxwell joined the United Nations Secretariat as an administrative assistant in the office of the Assistant Secretary-General for Economic Affairs. Since that time, with the exception of the academic year 1951-52, when he attended the University of Vienna Law School, he has served at Headquarters as Executive Assistant to the Treasurer and successively as Deputy Executive Officer and Programme Officer with the Technical Assistance Administration.

He has spent approximately half of his UN service with missions in the Far East (1948-50); Middle East (1958-60); Europe (1960-62), where he was Executive Officer for the Economic Commission for Europe, and Africa, where he served from 1962-64 as Chief of the Division of Administration, Conference and General Services at the Economic Commission for Africa in Addis Ababa. On his return to Headquarters in 1965, he joined the Office of Special Fund Operations.



#### UN HUMAN RIGHTS FIRST DAY NOV. 22

The United Nations Postal Administration will commemorate International Human Rights Year with the issuance of two postage stamps featuring a design by Robert Perrot of France, a member of the UN Graphic Presentation Unit, who also designed the FLOREX '68 cachet.

First day of issue is Nov. 22 at UN Headquarters in New York with the stamps being printed in six-cent and 13-cent denominations with the six-cent in blue and gold and the 13-cent in red and gold.

International Human Rights Year celebrates the 20th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights adopted by the UN in 1948. Eight other stamps in the Human Rights series have been issued by the UN since 1951.

### Clearwater Postal History Spans 110 Years; Began In Log Cabin

Since a year before the first Post Office was established in a log cabin in Clear Water Harbor Aug. 20, 1859, local postal history has been eventful and colorful, reaching a climax on Oct. 28, 1967, with the dedication of the modern new \$1 million Post Office on South Belcher Road between Drew Street and Gulf-to-Bay Blvd.

First postmaster was David Turner, member of a pioneer family which is still active in local affairs.

Earliest mail to Clear Water Harbor came in 1858 via the Gulf of Mexico aboard the steamer Madison Packet once weekly from Cedar Key.

During the 109 years before moving into the new facility last year, the Post Office has seen two name changes for the community. The original Clear Water Harbor was first changed to Clearwater Harbor and finally to Clearwater.

#### U. S. STAMP SALES

Visitors to FLOREX '68 will be able to purchase mint U. S. commemorative stamps on the exhibition floor.

Available at the Florex Exhibition Substation are all the recent six-cent commemoratives and many of the five-cent issues which preceded the increase in postal rates.

The special FLOREX cancellation is also being applied at the official U. S. substation. Thirteen different locations served as the Post Office before the new building was ready for occupancy, and the main PO at that time is now designated as the Downtown Branch Post Office.

The tremendous growth of the city is reflected in postal receipts which totaled \$10,900 in 1915. When the new Post Office was dedicated last year, receipts had increased to nearly \$2 million annually, and personnel had increased to 266 clerks, carriers and supervisors.

Fifteen persons have served as postmaster following David Turner. Cyrus Lowery occupied the post twice. Clearwater's only postmistress was Miss Sue Barco, who watched over the mails for more than 20 years.


