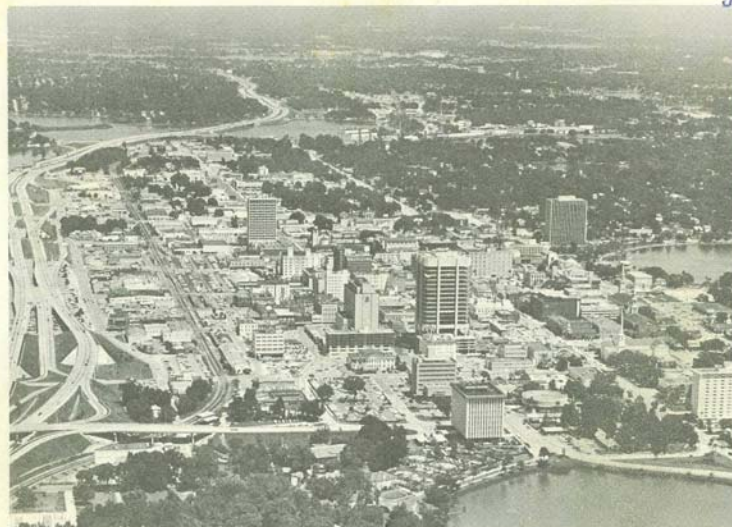

## Banquet Speaker, John J. Britt



Although he spent his youth in El Paso, Texas, John J. Britt is primarily thought of as a New Yorker. The past eight years, however, he has resided in North Miami and it is like pulling teeth to get him to return to New York to conduct New York State Bar examinations every June. He really loves Florida.

Mr. Britt has a long and distinguished stamp career that represents an endless chronicle of outstanding achievements with every conceivable award and honor that Philately can bestow. He is endowed with a dynamic drive from which Philately has been one of the chief beneficiaries.

Among the important organizations which he has served as president are the Collectors Club of N. Y., Aero Philatelists (a founder), and the Association for Stamp Exhibitions. He has been associated with many giants in the hobby like Alfred Lichtenston, Theodore Steinway, Clarence W. Brazer and Gen. Wickersham.

John Britt's exhibition prizes are legend. He has won dozens. In addition to these gold and silver memoirs, he cherishes his honorary life membership in the Hollywood Stamp Club (a co-founder)... he is one of the driving forces that has produced the biggest and most active local type stamp clubs in the country. In 1961 Mr. Britt was the recipient of the A. F. Lichtenstein Memorial Award for his distinguished services to philately.

In addition to the above mentioned organizations, he is a member of the American Philatelic Society, a Fellow in the Royal Philatelic Society of London, and enjoys membership in dozens of other national and international philatelic groups. It was his drive that created the much publicized, successful "School of Philately," sponsored by the Hollywood Stamp Club.

Due to his high reputation as an authority on stamps, as well as being an eloquent speaker, he is much sought after to act as chairman, M. C., as well as a judge at philatelic exhibitions. Mr. Britt also willingly gives his time to public welfare projects and fund-raising campaigns at which he is most effective.

## U. N. Stamp Sales

Mint United Nations postage stamps will be on sale at face value for the first time ever in Florida during FLOREX '71, October 22-24.

October 22 is first day of issue for the regular 8-cents issue and 60-cents special delivery stamp. The U.N. counter will accept envelope for special first day cancellation. Addressed envelopes with U.N. stamps

affixed will be carried via pouch mail to New York.

October 24 is the 20th Anniversary of the U.N. A special souvenir card will also be available for this event at the exhibition floor.

Look for the booth near the large and exciting special exhibit of UN philatelic material in the exhibition hall.

## U. S. Lunar Post Office's Special Exhibit

*FLOREX '71 is happy to present the exhibition of the "Lunar Post Office". Mr. Brian Green, Philatelic Consultant for the U.S.P.S. in Washington, D. C., accompanies this special exhibit.*

The Lunar Post Office, called by NASA an ancillary storage container, is of Beta cloth, a combination of fiber glass, aluminum foil and asbestos, that can withstand temperatures of 2,400 degrees. It was attached under the driver's seat of the lunar rover, the first manned vehicle to operate on the moon.

It is about 9½ inches long, six inches wide and four inches deep. Inside the white kit is a snap-fastened pocket that contained the envelope which carried the space achievement commemorative stamps. Dominant in these twin stamps is the lunar rover.

Other fold-out pockets in the kit contained a stamp pad and rubber postmarking device, which applied the cancellation, "United States on the Moon, August 2, 1971"



Cancellation of the first stamp on the surface of the moon by David R. Scott and James B. Irwin signaled the placing of the Space Achievement stamps on sale at three earth post offices.

Three souvenir folders, differing only in first-day cancellations can be ordered as a set for \$3 - from "Space Souvenir Folder, Postmaster, Orlando, Florida 32802.

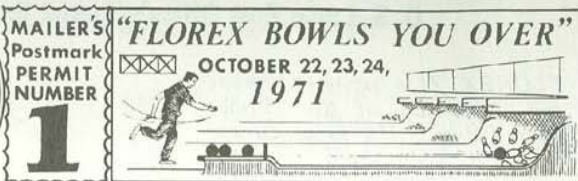

Our official Florex cachet this year is quite beautiful. Again, as last year, TSGT. WALTER H. RAND designed the cachet, a multicolor drawing. At the present TSgt. Rand is serving as Chief illustrator at the USAF Special Operation School, Hurlburt Field, Ft. Walton Beach. In his military service with the National Guard, Army and Air Force he served in the Korean War, Formosa and Vietnam. In addition to his military duties, "Terry," as he is more commonly known, runs the Rand Sign Company, designing and producing quality artwork and workmanship. He is a very active member of the West Florida Stamp Club. After his retirement he intends to settle in Florida.

In 1967, The Florida Federation for the first time presented its own FLOREX awards — medals cast in gold, silver and bronze. These were authorized by the executive committee at the 1967 Stamporee in Jacksonville and first used in Sebring that year. The face of the medal bears the official Federation Seal, which was designed by Fred. B. Klein of Daytona Beach and adopted in 1953. The reverse of the medal is plain to permit appropriate engraving annually.

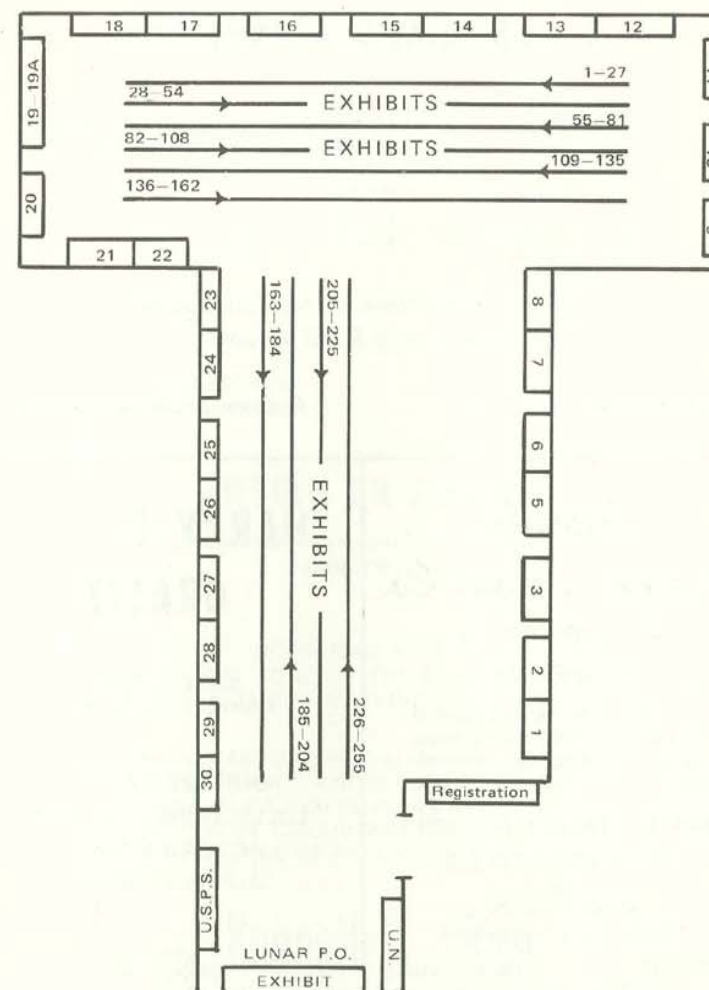

### **Florida Federation and Florex**

The Florida Federation of Stamp Clubs was organized on December 18, 1949, in St. Petersburg, Florida. It is an organization of clubs and any club holding regular meetings is welcome to belong.

The first FLOREX show was staged in 1950 in Winter Haven with an informal exhibit of 15 frames and 50 people attending.

Next show was in 1951 in Miami. The same year, the monthly bulletin: The Florida Philatelist was published under the editorship of George Ritter.

1952 "Extamp" held in Tampa had already a 260-frame exhibition and the first-cachet cover (designed by F.D. Parslow).

In 1953 "Florex" became the official name and the official seal was adopted in Orlando.

Throughout the years the FLOREX has been hosted by many of our Florida Clubs: St. Petersburg, 1954, 1959; West Palm Beach, 1956, 1962; Miami area clubs, 1957, 1965, 1969; Clearwater, 1953, 1964, 1968; Leesburg, 1955, 1960; Daytona Beach, 1961 and Sebring, 1967.

In 1970 at the Spring Executive Session in Panama City it was decided that the Florida Federation of Stamp Clubs will sponsor the future FLOREX shows. So FLOREX 1970 in Orlando was the first Federation-sponsored show and another milestone in our history.

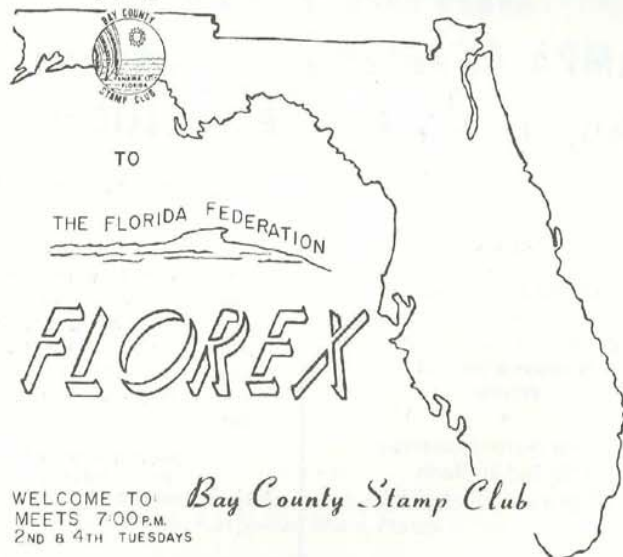

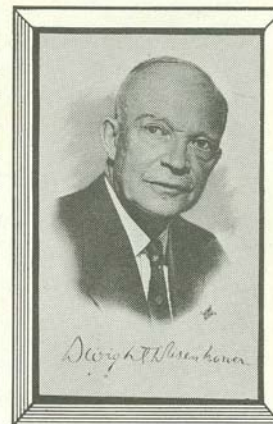
