member of the popular Hollywood Stamp Club.

STORY OF FLORIDA FEDERATION STAMP CLUB, INC. AND FLOREX

The Florida Federation of Stamp Clubs was organized on December 18, 1949, in St. Petersburg, Florida. It is an organization of clubs and any club holding regular meetings is welcome to belong.

The first FLOREX show was staged in 1950 in Winter Haven with an informal exhibit of 15 frames and 50 people attending.

Next show was in 1951 in Miami. The same year, the monthly bulletin: The Florida Philatelist was published under the editorship of George Ritter.

1952 "Extamp" held in Tampa had already a 260-frame exhibition and the first cachet cover (designed by F.D. Parslow)

In 1953 "Florex" became the official name and the official seal was adopted in Orlando.

Throughout the years the FLOREX has been hosted by many of our Florida Clubs: St. Petersburg, 1954, 1959; West Palm Beach, 1956, 1969; Miami area clubs, 1957, 1965, 1969; Clearwater, 1953, 1964, 1968; Leesburg, 1955, 1960; Daytona Beach, 1961; Sebring, 2967 and Orlando, 1970, 1971.

In 1970 at the Spring Executive Session in Panama City it was decided that the Florida Federation of Stamp Clubs will sponsor the future FLOREX shows. So FLOREX 1970 in Orlando was the first Federation-sponsored show and another milestone in our history.

in 1972 FLOREX was held in Clearwater.



The WMO is a specialized agency of the United Nations and was created to coordinate and standardize international meteorological services. 137 nations are members of WMO, with headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland.





Above shown are stamps issued by the United Nations and Switzerland.

The Souvenir—card illustrates — in color — stamps issued by the United Nations and the WMO agency, which headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland. The card measures approx. 5 3/4" by 8". Each stamp is surrounded by a narrow black border to accent the color of the stamp. Printer is the Sunshine Press of Venice, Fla. A limited numbered issue of 3000 is printed and the plates officially destroyed.

Cost per mint copy is \$1.25, orders over 50 cards \$1.00 p.p. Cancelled with UN show—cancel \$1.50, orders over 50 cards \$1.35.




