

I would personally like to thank all of you for attending and hope that you enjoy FLOREX '79, the site of the Fourth Annual Convention of the Society of Indo-China Philatelists. All visitors are cordially welcome to attend the SICP General Meeting held during the show and to visit with members of the SICP or to drop by the SICP table and become members under the special member-

ship rates in effect only during FLOREX '79.

The work involved in preparing and setting up of our Society's convention is not nearly as involved as the efforts required in the preparation and execution of a major show such as **FLOREX** but I would like to take this opportunity to thank the involved members of the 1979 **FLOREX** Committee who have helped to make our Annual Convention possible. Among the many who have aided are General Chairman David Schaefer, Walter Nazarenko, Norman Olson, and Wade Berry. To them, the SICP gives their thanks and wish them the best results from their efforts. None of the work involved could have been successful, however, without the efforts of SICP member Melvin "Mel" Kessler who acted as the "middle man" (and did much of the work) between the SICP and the **FLOREX** Committee in his position as SICP Convention Coordinator. The gratitude of the SICP Membership is extended to everyone involved.

The Society of Indo-China Philatelists is approaching its tenth anniversary and presently has members in the U.S., Canada, Europe (Sweden, France, Germany, Great Britain, etc.), Asia (the Philippines, Hong Kong, etc.) and Australia, truly an international group of philatelists interested in the postal matters and issues of the Indo-China area. The SICP publishes the bi-monthly Indo-China Philatelist, an award winning publication (in literature competition in the U.S. and Switzerland) that is mailed to members by first class mail. The SICP also holds 3-4 mail auctions of members' material per year and the listings and realizations appear in the ICP. Anyone interested in the philately of the Indo-China area (Annam, Tonkin, Cochin China, French Indo-China, Cambodia, Laos, and/or Viet Nam) is invited to become a member.

Our thanks again to everyone for attending and participating with best philatelic wishes to all of you.

The Society of Indo-China Philatelists

The Society of Indo-China Philatelists was founded in October 1971 by James D. Hogbin and organized for the study of the postal issues and postal history of Indo-China, Laos, Cambodia, and Viet Nam. The SICP is a non-profit philatelic fraternity associated with the American Philatelic Society as Affiliate #38, and with the Society of Philatelic Americans as Branch #362. The First issue of The Indo-China Philatelist appeared in January 1971. This inaugural issue of the ICP consisted of twenty pages and included a listing of the interim officers (Allen D. Kerr, President) and the first thirty members. The second issue of the ICP contained the SICP By-laws and a listing of sixty-five new members. An outstanding beginning for the new society.

The first SICP Members' Auction appeared in the May 1971 issue of the ICP which also announced a contest among members to design a society emblem/seal. The first auction contained twenty-four lots of members' material and the SICP commission was fixed at 10% of the realization. In the December 1971 issue of the journal, Charles F. Bekker was announced as the winner of the emblem design contest and his design is still being used as the official

SICP logo.

December 1971 also marked the completion of the first year of the SICP, now with over two hundred members, and the election of Allen D. Kerr and Dr. David Torres as President and Vice President, respectively, of the SICP.

SICP Founder James D. Hogbin continued to serve the society in a dual role as Editor and Executive Secretary until the summer of 1972 when Morton Nash was appointed to the position as Editor of the ICP. Early 1973 saw the resignation of President Kerr and VP Torres assuming command of the society. An index to the first ten issues of the ICP appeared in August 1973 and in November of the same year, a Membership Director was distributed. The February 1974 ICP contained the election results which showed James D. Hogbin being elected to the Presidency and Lee Wade to be the Vice President for the two-year term of office.

Severe illness of the ICP editor and the inability to find a willing replacement resulted in extensive delays in publishing the ICP in 1974-1975. The society auctions, which normally appeared in the pages of the ICP were mailed to the members during this time and significantly helped to bind the members together as a society until publication of the ICP could be resumed on a normal basis. In March 1976 the ICP again appears, this time under the temporary editorship of former editor and now president Jim Hogbin. Mark Isaacs of Chicago has become the Executive Secretary of the society. The results of the fall 1975 election show that Hogbin and Wade are re-elected to their respective offices of President and Vice President of the SICP.

During the spring of 1976 the auction commission was raised to 12% with a rate of 15% to become effective on 31 December of the same year. The commission has since remained at 15% of the amount realized. There have been twenty-seven SICP Mail Auctions from 1971 through July 1979 which contained a total of two thousand, one hundred sixty-five (2,165) lots of material relating to the philately of the Indo-China area.

July 1976 marked the first appearance of a new SICP newsletter. Cold Facts, which contained society News, ads, and auctions. The ICP would continue to contain philatelic articles and research papers. The two publications were scheduled to be published in alternating months, each

appearing six times per year. President Hogbin had assigned Lee Wade to edit the Cold Facts and Robert Moorefield was appointed to edit the ICP. This first issue of Cold Facts carried the announcement of the first SICP Convention, scheduled to be held during SESCAL (15-17 October 1976) in Los Angeles.

In September, the title "Cold Facts" was changed to "Indo-Info" as being more appropriate for our tropical area of interest, Indo-Info, the new newsletter, appeared for two issues. In November it was decided to reincorporate society news, ads, etc. in the ICP along with the phiatelic articles on a regular bi-monthly publication schedule with Robert Moorefield as editor. Mr. Moorefield has remained as editor of the ICP and issues have continued to be mailed to the members in each odd-numbered month for almost three years

The Indo-China Philatelist continues to be an outstanding philatelic publication, receiving awards in literature competition in Switzerland and the United States. In addition to articles on specific stamps, overprint and printing varieties, booklets, coils, flights and cachets; the ICP has also contained series of articles in several issues such as Allen Kerr's long running series on the First Day Covers of Laos; Jacques Desrousseaux's installments on the Postal History of Indo-China which listed and illustrated various cancels used in the area as well as other pertinent information; listings of the revenue stamps used in the Indo-China area including the independent issues of Cambodia, Laos & Viet Nam which appeared through the cooperation of the American Revenue Association; and 1977 saw the beginning of a series by Bertram Mendelsohn on a specialized catalog of Indo-China. The ICP continues to contain articles of interest and information on all fields and areas of the Indo-China region as well as keeping members informed of news of the society and activities of the society's services such as advertising and auctions and, of course, the society conventions.

Prior to the September 1979 issue of the ICP, the thirty-six previous issues plus the three issues of the short-lived newsletter totaled 998 pages of information for the members of the SICP.

During the past three years the SICP has become more active as a society with FLOREX '79 being its fourth consecutive annual convention. Just prior to the first convention in 1976, Founder and then-President Hogbin resigned his position due to ill health and other matters. Vice President Wade became the new President and presided at the membership meeting at SESCAL. In late 1977 elections were again held and Lee Wade was elected President with Lawrence Popowski as Vice President. The SICP's second convention was held during SEPAD in Philadelphia from 7-9 October and a fourteen-page membership directory was distributed in 1977. Early in 1978 the society learned of the death of James D. Hogbin, founder of the SICP, former editor, president, executive secretary and "sparkplug" for many years.

1978 also saw the appearance of the first all-Asian stamp exhibition in San Francisco and the SICP did its part by holding its third convention during ASIAPEX '78 from 21-23 April. The highlight, as usual during the conventions, was the excellent display of exhibits including several by SICP members, many of which received major awards. And now, in 1979, we are having our fourth convention here at FLOREX '79 and several of our members continue

to participate by having exhibits on display.
