The Romance of the Riverboat

During the 19th century, the sound of the steam whistle played sweet music for many Florida pioneers. The arrival of the steamboat along the St. Mary's, the St. Johns, the Suwanee, and the Apalachicola Rivers represented commerce and communication for the settlers.

Lake Okeechobee and the Kissimmee River valley became accessable from the west via the Cooosahatchee River and the east via the North New River Canal to Ft. Lauderdale. Only the completion of the railroad system doomed the picturesque service. Even then, rallroad tycoons like Henry Flagler linked his rail service with steamship service to Cuba and the Caribbean.

Pictured on the cover is artist Terry Dietrich's image of the Fredrick De Bary plying the waters of the St. John's. His pencil sketch portrays the romance of travel. It reminds me of the award-winning exhibit by Niles Schuh of manuscript markings of towns along the St. John's.

A canny collector will inspect the contents of covers with steamship markings from Savannah and Charlston and find that they own a piece of Florida history, for those markings only indicate where the letter entered the postal service. It may have started its journey at Enterprise, Welaka, or Picolata.

Be sure to stop by the welcome table and purchase a cover or a souvenir card and be reminded of a bygone era. Or is it? Last spring, I boarded the "Rivership Romance" at Sanford for a three hour cruise down the St. John's. The modern power source is diesel, but the nostalgia remains. Disney's Magic Kingdom has the "Admiral Joe Fowler" which has taken millions on short rides. We hope you enjoy our salute to Florida's Age of Riverboats.

YOUTH AREA

This is the fourth year that Lewis Etherton has served as Chairman of the youth exhibit. Each year, this area has grown, and more kids than ever have come to the show.

This year the theme is the topic of nature. "Uncle Lew," as he is known to the hundreds of kids he has brought to stamp collecting, has located a number of examples of snakes, shells, birds, etc. from nature with a matching topical stamp. Even older visitors and the young at heart will enjoy the youth corner.

Etherton has served for years as a counselor for the Pathfinder organization which is a youth program similar to Scouts that is run by the Seventh-day Adventist church. He has arranged exhibits for thousands of Pathfinders at national camporees in Colorado and Pennsylvania.

The American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors

The American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors AAPE was formed in 1986 in order to share and discuss ideas and techniques geared to improving the standards of exhibit preparation, judging and the management of exhibitions. We exist to serve the entire range of people who work or have an interest in one of more of these fields; whether they be novice, experienced or just beginning to think about getting involved. Through pursuit of our purposes, it is our goal to encourage your increasing participation and enjoyment of philatelic exhibiting.

After only four and a half years of existence, AAPE has over 1300 members who cover the full range of novice exhibitor to winners of international Grand Prix. Non-exhibiting show administrators, and people who are interested in learning how to better appreciate exhibits are also welcome, and indeed are contributing members of the group.

The highlight of AAPE membership is our lively quarterly journal, <u>The Philatelic Exhibitor</u>. It is a forum for debate on practices (current and suggested), and problems that must be overcome in doing a good job, in all areas of putting on and running a show.

Another highlight is the Exhibit Critique Service that gives members the opportunity to have their exhibits reviewed by judges who can spend hours at home rather than minutes in front of a frame. Every effort is made to match the exhibit to a judge who knows or exhibits the area being shown. International judges are available to look at exhibits that are being prepared or need alteration for entering at international shows. Judges will also review title pages and synposis pages alone on request.

AAPE sponsors two much-sought-after exhibiting awards that are aimed at encouraging diversity and creativity in exhibiting, and the mastering of effective presentation techniques. The first, AAPE Award of Excellence for Presentation, is given at all shows from local through national. The second, the AAPE Creativity Award just recently instituted, is available only at national World Series of Philately (WSP) shows.

AAPE's continued

Our latest venture, with the support of the Chicago Collectors Club, Boys' Town, Nebr., the U.S. Postal Service, Dr. Gene Scott, and others is the first year of AAPE's American Youth Stamp Exhibiting Competition (AYSEC) under the Chairmanship of Florida's own Carl Burnett. The culmination of AYSEC '89-'90 is the head-to-head competition at this year's FLOREX of the exhibits of eight young people who were winners of youth grands at WSP shows during the last exhibiting year. AAPE has already received assurances of increased participation by more of the 35 WSP shows during the '90-'91 exhibiting year, and hopes that eventually allWSP shows will send a youth grand winner to AYSEC!

The national AYSEC competition will be held each year as part of AAPE's annual convention at a well known national show. Next year we will be at the 1991 Omaha Stamp Show (Aug 30-Sept 1). The following year will see our convention at Chicago's World Columbian Stamp Expo.

We hope that you will participate in our seminars at FLOREX, and stop by the AAPE table to register, meet your officers, and/or join AAPE. Many of our members believe that AAPE is the most helpful and interesting society membership they hold, and we'd like to prove to you that they are right!

Collecting Colombia States A Question of Rarity

According to the 1988 Scott Catalog, a "complete" collection of all stamps listed as "Colombia States" (Including Local Provisionals for the National posts) will total a bit over \$14,000 for the "major numbers" alone. The listed varieties add about \$8,700 to this total. Yet I guarantee that, armed with even \$50,000 and a lot of patience, you cannot assemble a "complete" collection--because the key items are just not available.

The stamps of the Colombia States are roughly analogous to those of the German, Italian, or Indian States. Antioquia issued its first stamps in 1868, Bolivar in 1863, Cundinamarca and Tolima in 1870. These stamps rank with the "Classics" or world philately, but are demonstrably scarcer. Catalog prices reflect "demand" as well as supply; this alone explains why the first issue of Antioquia is far less "expensive" than the Swiss Cantonals (which, as any Corinphila catalog can attest, are vastly more plentiful).

Auction records going back to the de Coppet sale of 1893 will confirm just how few examples there are of any key Colombia States issue. Cauca #1, the 1879 Choco Seal issue, exists in just 6 examples, three of which are on two covers; other major numbers are in similarly short supply, from two or three to perhaps a couple dozen examples of each. Major plate varieties (most tete-beche pairs, se-tenant cliche errors, etc.) are, if anything even scarcer.

No more than about 200 covers are known with Colombia States frankings, though there are at least twice that many with, say Bavaria #1, yet some Colombia States covers, e.g. Bolivar bisects, can be bought for a fraction of the price of a Bavaria #1 cover. The Type-sets of Tolima exist on just 4 covers, Bolivar #1 on just 8 (including two fronts); no covers have yet been discovered on the first issues of Antlogula or Cundinamarca.

An additional factor was that the Colombia States issues, by and large, were supposed to be used within the State, thus none of the Classic issues were sent to Europe or the USA, where it is more likely that they would have survived. Bisect covers are the exception that proves the rule - you can't profitably "soak" a bisect. What little we have of multiples or covers survived by happenstance; three 1870 issue Tolima covers are from one correspondence; six of the eight Bolivar #1 covers are from another.

What is the serious collector of Colombia States to do? There are three guiding rules - hope, luck, and persistence. Given sufficient desire to "do something" with these issues, one has to hope that something interesting will come on the market - a multiple, a cover, a specialized article, and old-time collection loaded with shades and varieties. Luck plays a part, in being in the right place at the right time (with the wherewithal) when a "find" turns up. And persistence is definitely necessary - collecting Colombia States is a project for a lifetime.

The rewards are self evident - you can be the first to chronicle a new discovery, or the fruits of patient research into an issue. Furthermore, if prices at recent auctions are an indication, there are more and more collectors who are willing to pay a price commensurate with rarity for multiples, varieties, and covers. As collectors worldwide look about for an area that is, in many ways, "virgin territory" for research (and the recognition that goes with it), demand will meet rarity in the marketplace, and today's absurd catalog values for the scarcer material will be replaced by new levels, commensurate wih the "good old days" when prices for Colombia States (then in demand by worldwide collectors) were, in relative terms, many times what they are today.

The general or Latin America collector who only knows the country from album pages or a stamp catalog can miss the important parts of the postal history of Panama. The state of Panama, then a part of the United States of Colombia, issued the first postage stamps in 1878. These stamps, Scott 1-7, were only for mail within the state or mail originating in one of the small towns in the interior of the state and sent to a destination within Colombia.

In 1887, the Republic of Colombia issued special stamps for use in Panama, but valid on international mail. The reason for this issue and the issues of 1892-96 was that silver currency circulated in Panama while paper currency nominally backed by gold circulated in the rest of Colombia. The two currencies were of unequal value and the special stamps were issued to prevent loss of income by the national postal agencies in Panama on stamps purchased for paper currency elsewhere and brought to Panama.

However, before these two issues, Panama already had a rich postal history. During the colonial period it was a major transit point for shipment of precious metals from Peru to Spain. Naturally, letters accompanied these shipments. Many were official documents, some of which can be found in the Council of the Indies in Cadiz.

A few covers and folded letters from private mail have survived, postmarked in the city of Panama or in Portobelo, the Caribbean port from which the gold fleet sailed to Spain. Colonial covers are also known from the towns of Penonome, Veraguas, and Los Santos. (Figure 1)

When Panama declared its independence from Spain, it joined the Republic of Colombia, a federation of present-day Venezuela, Colombia, and Ecuador formed by Simon Bolivar. When this federation disolved in 1830, Panama remained a part of Colombia which was known successively as the Republic of New Granada, the Grenadine Confederation, and the United States of Colombia. Covers from the pre-stamp period, 1830-1859, from Pananma are scarce.

Panama still served as a transit route for goods being shipped between the Pacific coasts of South and Central America and the United States and Europe, but the volume was much less than the colonial trade. This changed when gold was discovered in California. The routes to California across Panama and Nicaragua were faster than the overland route across the United States, and these two routes competed for the freight, passengers, and mail of the Forty Niners. In 1855, the Panama railroad was completed across the isthmus from the new town of Colon (known as Aspinwall by the Americans) to Panama.

The railroad gave Panama an advantage over Nicaragua, and it became the main trade route bringing a period of prosperity until the U.S. transcontinental railroads were completed. Most mail originating in Panama for foreign destinations was handled by forwarding agents. Agents included most of the shipping firms operating in Panama as well as many of the American consuls. Markings used by over 50 forwarding agents in Panama are known. (Figure 2)

Most stamps issued by Colombia from 1859-1887 were used in Panama. They are usually found with oval handstamps of Panama or Colon. Few covers from Panama are franked with Colombian stamps and sent to foreign destinations are known from 1859 until Colombia joined the U.P.U. in 1881. Mial not handled by forwarding agents was usually mailed at the British consulates in Panama, Changres, and Colon. British stamps as well as datestamps and transit markings are found on transit mail. (Figure 3)

A special registration stamp, Panama Scott F1, was part of the 1887-88 issue for Panama, but all Colombian registration, late fee, and acknowledgement of receipt stamps were used in Panama through 1903. They can be found on cover in combination with postage stamps of the Panama issues of 1887-1894. Colombian postal cards were also used in Panama from 1881-1903.

A major civil war known as "The 1000 Days" disrupted Colombia from 1899-1902. A rebel attack on the city of Panama during 1900 was defeated, but during the last year of the war the rebels held most of the interior of Panama and twice defeated government armies at Aguadulce. Due to shortages of Colombian registration stamps in Panama, provisional stamps were issued during the war (Panama Scott F3-F5).

A Colombian government decree of 24 March 1903 required that stamps of the special issues for Panama be used exclusively in the towns of Pasto, Tuquerres, Tumaco and Barbacoas where silver currency was in use. These towns are located in southern Colombia along the border with Ecudaor. A limited number of covers documenting this use have survived and a knowledgeable specialist with a sharp eye can spot the circular duplex or boxed rectangular markngs of these towns on loose stamps of the Panama issue of 1892-1896.

When Panama declared its independence from Colombia on 3 November 1903, there were large stocks of the special issues for Panama, Colombian postal cards and Colombian registration, acknowledgement of receipt and late fee stamps of 1902-1903 issue on hand. These were overprinted to produce the 1903-1906 Panama provisionals. Overprinted special issues for Panama were further overprinted to produce the early issues of the Canal Zone.

Steve Schumann comes from Hayward, CA where he works with judges and exhibits for WESTPEX. He is also the newly elected predisent of AAPE'S.


Don Jones lives in Norfolk, VA where he is involved with VAPEX. He is also a leader in the American Airmail Society.
